Performance Directives

Amateur Status:

- ◆ This show is for Amateurs only. **Must be 22 years of age** and have not trained any horse/rider combination for compensation. *Please refer to USEF rules GR101, 1306, and 119.3*

Entries:

All entrants in this competition enter with the agreement that they have read and understand this OFFICIAL PRIZE LIST and agree to follow all the class specifications, requirements, directives, regulations, policies, terms and conditions herein.

- **LIMITING TWO HORSES PER COMPETITOR:** Only one horse can be eligible for Division Championships
- Online (at Dunmovin.net) entries only. All entries must be complete with entry form, full payment and Required Documents (described below) to the Show Secretary, *no exceptions*. All entries must be RECEIVED by the closing date, see note below about late entries and fees. No class changes after closing date. Management reserves the right to return entries that are incomplete or inaccurate. No exhibitor is permitted to show until all fees are paid. Competitors will be subject to USEF Non – negotiable funds Rule (GR 1508.1). **ACCEPTING: VISA, MASTERCARD, DISCOVER, AMERICAN EXPRESS.**

- ◆ **Required Documents:** Coggins within a year and Vaccination Report meeting the requirements defined in USEF GR 845 must be submitted with entry. When all required documents and payments are received, Entry Agreements and liability waivers will be emailed for electronic signatures to complete the entry.
- ◆ **NO MAIL-IN, TELEPHONE, DROPPED OFF, EMAILED OR FAXED ENTRIES ACCEPTED! ALL ENTRIES MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE.**
- ◆ Late entries accepted, if scheduling permits, with a \$75 late fee. Entries received **after the closing date will NOT** be given preference over entries received by the closing date. Scratches may be filled at the regular fee by horses already entered in this competition.
- ◆ Entry Confirmation: If you have not been notified of your status two weeks before the show, please confirm entry with the Show Secretary.
- ◆ Refunds: Before closing date - full refund less Processing Fee. After closing date - NO REFUNDS. "No refunds" includes but is not limited to stabling and overpayments, for any reason including cancellations due to Acts of God, acts of terrorism, inclement weather, and/or other emergencies.
- ◆ All qualified refunds will be made within 30 days of the end of the competition.

Waitlist:

- ◆ Waitlist can be entered online at Dunmovin.net
- ◆ Only complete entries will be placed on the waitlist.
- ◆ Refunds: Minus processing fee will be returned within 30 days of end of competition

Time Schedule:

- ◆ Official time schedule will be posted in the show office by noon on Friday, August 26th. Unofficial time schedule will be posted on the website and Foxvillage four days before the show.
- ◆ Freestyle music test times will be posted in the show office by noon on Friday, August 26th.
- ◆ Freestyle Music: Three Options: 1) MP3 file- send to Dana at dguthrie4@comcast.net 48 hours before show. 2) Bring owner ipad or mobile device that has a headphone jack - submitted to secretary at time of registration 3. CD - two copies - submitted to secretary at time of registration.
- ◆ Schooling: Schooling schedules will be posted in the show office and online

General Competition Directives, Regulations, and Policies

- ◆ EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.
- ◆ Amateur must warm up horse. Trainers are not allowed to warm up horse.
- ◆ WORKING OUT OF TRAILERS: Horses must be hand walked down Berkley Rd. behind show grounds to back gate. Entering side gate from Dorset Rd. with horses is prohibited.
- ◆ US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION (USEF) rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the show grounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire.
- ◆ Everyone on show grounds will need to comply with current CDC and local COVID-19 restrictions or requirements, as of the time of the show. Violators will be asked to leave and no refunds will be given.
- ◆ "Schooling Show Attire" accepted for performance. Formal attire optional.
- ◆ Management reserves the right to split, combine, delete, or add classes dependent on entries. Management also reserves the right to add or substitute judges or make any changes required by circumstances.
- ◆ Competitors may cross enter Levels but will not be eligible for High Score Division Awards, but will be eligible for performance awards. (See "Awards")
- ◆ Numbers must be worn on horses at all times when a horse is out of its stall, including when being exercised or ridden.
- ◆ Hazardous Weather/Accident/Acts of God, and Emergency Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any class(es) due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accident, or emergency. Every effort will be made to reschedule classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies.
- ◆ All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled.

- ◆ DOGS MUST BE ON LEASHES AT ALL TIMES WHILE ON SHOW GROUNDS OR IN STABLE AREAS. PENALTIES WILL APPLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH USEF GR1301.6
- ◆ Levels: Current editions of all FEI/USEF/USDF tests/score sheets will be used.
- ◆ Schooling: Schooling schedules will be posted in the show office.
- ◆ Area Veterinarians: Will be on call. Emergency numbers will be posted in the Show and Stable offices.
- ◆ Farrier: Will be on call.
- ◆ Protective Headgear: DR120.6 states: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds SSTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.
- ◆ NO SMOKING IN OR AROUND THE BARN! Smoking in or around the barns is strictly prohibited. This is a zero-tolerance policy, violators may be asked to leave the show grounds.

Stabling:

- ◆ No horses will be admitted to the grounds before noon, Friday August 26, 2022. and must exit the grounds by 7 pm Sunday night.
- ◆ Permanent 10x10 wooden stalls with doors are on the show grounds. Alteration of stalls or barn structure is strictly prohibited. Careful attention is given to assignment of horse and tack stalls. Do not use stalls not assigned to you or you will be charged. Anyone found changing stalls or using any stall without the prior permission of the Stabling Office will be assessed a \$100 fine per stall. Placing ANYTHING in a stall constitutes the use of a stall. Additional stalls may be rented when you arrive, please see the stable manager. Sharps containers are provided in the barn areas.
- ◆ “Stall Watch”, a nighttime check on your horse(s), can be arranged with the stabling manager online or upon arrival.

Arenas:

- ◆ Competitions will take place outdoors in 20M X 60M all-weather sand, geo-felt & fiber mix arenas.
- ◆ Competition classes will be held in the Wheeler or Dixon Oval show rings. There is no guarantee in which ring classes will be held.
- ◆ Warm-up will be all-weather sand, geo felt & fiber mix.
- ◆ Lunging: permitted in designated areas only during off-show hours. All lunging must conclude 30 minutes before scheduled classes begin. Lunging and warm-up schedules will be posted and times strictly adhered to.

General Information:

- ◆ Food: Available on grounds 8/26-28.
- ◆ Parking: Do not arrive after 9 pm Friday, August 26. Trailers or vans will not be allowed to park inside show grounds except for brief loading and unloading. Parking and security will be provided in the surrounding designated parking lots. Trailers or vans will be allowed to park in four designated parking lots directly outside of the show grounds. Be prepared with wheelbarrows or hand trucks to unload on the street or in the parking lot. If your arrival time will be after dark, be aware that lighting is limited in the back barn unloading area.
- ◆ Directions: From Interstate 95 take Rt. 476 to Villanova/St. David exit 13 to Rt. 30 West. The Horse Show grounds are approximately 6 miles on the left. From Pennsylvania Turnpike, take Rt. 476 south exit, and then follow directions above. Please enter 23 Dorset Road, Devon, PA 19333 into your GPS or Mapquest navigator.

Awards:

- ◆ 1st - 10th place ribbons awarded in each class.
- ◆ High Score Division Awards: This is presented at each Level.
 - High score is calculated by the average of two tests ridden at the same level.
 - One of the two tests ridden must be the second test of the level, i.e: Tr. 2, First2 etc.
 - Must ride two tests of the level which will be averaged for high score
- ◆ Performance Awards: Competitors must sign up for the awards for which they are eligible. Each award is received by the competitor with the highest score of the day.
 - OTTB - Off the Track Thoroughbred
 - Iberian
 - Vintage - > 50 Years of Age
 - Master - > 60 Years of Age
 - Adult Amateur on a Pony - 14.2 hands or under
 - Adult Amateur on a Horse – over 14.2 hands to 16.0 hands
 - Adult Amateur on a Horse – over 16.0 hands
 - Classic – highest combined Rider /Horse age

- ◆ Specialty Awards:
 - ❖ Lesley King Award - This award is given in the memory of Lesley King and her horse Time Lord (aka Romy) to the competitor with the highest score at the highest Level of the show
 - ❖ “You Win - They Win” Division Award - Canter your way to the top of your division for a great prize and a generous donor will make a \$250 contribution in your name to a charity of your choice! This is awarded to each division!!

Fees:

1. Processing Fee: \$65.00
2. Class Fee: \$65.00/class
3. Musical Freestyle: \$85.00
4. Working out of Trailer: \$75.00/day/entrant
5. Stabling: Does not include bedding
 - Day Stall: \$60.
 - 3 pm or later Friday – Saturday 9:00 PM: \$100.00/stall/tack stall
 - 3 pm or later Friday – Sunday: \$160/stall/tack stall
 - Saturday – Sunday: \$120/stall/tack stall
6. Bedding - \$12 SHAVINGS PER BAG PRE-ORDER. Pre-order your shavings up to 48 hours before start of show. The shavings will be delivered to your stall prior to your arrival. Additional shavings will be available for purchase in the stable office during the show, cost per bag may increase after pre-order.
7. Late fee: \$75.00, if scheduling permits.
8. Non-negotiable checks will incur a \$50.00 charge.
9. Utility Hook Ups: \$60.00/calendar day or any part of calendar day/night (vehicles, campers, trailers).
10. “Night Check”: \$20 per night per horse. A nighttime check on your horse(s) can be arranged upon check-in. Night time check includes adding water to buckets, giving hay and/or feed provided by owner/rider.
