COMPETITION RULES & GENERAL INFORMATION

ENTRY CONDITIONS

- By submitting an entry, competitors acknowledge that they have read the Official Prize List and agree to comply with all rules, requirements, class specifications, and conditions contained therein.
- Competition Management reserves the right to reject or return any entry that is incomplete, inaccurate, unpaid, or otherwise does not comply with competition requirements.
- Competition Management reserves the right to limit, combine, divide, split, cancel, add, or modify classes, adjust ride times, substitute judges, and make any changes necessary for the efficient operation of the competition.
- NO MAIL-IN, TELEPHONE, DROPPED-OFF, EMAILED, OR FAXED ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

COMPLETE ENTRIES MUST INCLUDE

All complete entries received by the closing date will be entered into a drawing for a special prize.

Entries must include:

- Completed Dunmovin Dressage Days Entry Form.
- Applicable class fees.
- \$65 Processing Fee per entry.
- \$25 USEF Federation Fee per entry (includes \$15 Drugs & Medication Fee and \$10 USEF Fee).
- Stabling and/or day parking fees, if applicable.
- Emergency contact information.
- A legible email address. Confirmations, updates, ride times, and competition communications will be sent electronically.

Membership & Registration Documentation

Copies or verification of current USEF and USDF memberships and registrations for: Rider, Owner, Trainer, Horse, Coach (if applicable)

Applicable USEF and/or USDF non-member fees must be paid if memberships are not current.

Health Documentation

- Negative Coggins dated within one year of the competition date. Horse name on the entry must match the Coggins report and USEF/USDF records. (USEF GR907.3)
- USEF Vaccination Record showing Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes vaccination within six months of the competition date. (USEF GR845)

Qualifying Entries

- Competitors wishing to ride as GAIG/USDF Qualifying must indicate qualifying status on the entry form and pay an additional \$20 qualifying fee per class.
- For qualifying rides, riders must hold a current USDF Participating Membership and owners must hold a current USDF Participating or Business Membership.

Musical Freestyle Entries

- A copy of the qualifying test or USDF score verification must accompany all Musical Freestyle entries.
- Horse/rider combinations must meet the freestyle qualification requirements outlined in USEF Rule DR129.9.

Payment Requirements

- No exhibitor will be permitted to compete until all fees have been paid in full.
- Competitors are subject to the USEF Non-Negotiable Funds Rule (GR1508.1).

LATE ENTRIES & WAITLIST

- Late entries may be accepted if space is available and are subject to a \$75.00 late entry fee.
- Only complete entries will be placed on the waitlist.
- Competitors offered a ride time from the waitlist will be notified by Competition Management.
- Waitlist refunds will be issued in full, less applicable processing fees, within 30 days following the competition.

REFUND POLICY

- **Before Closing Date**
 - Refunds will be issued less applicable processing fees.
- **After Closing Date**
 - No refunds will be issued for scratches for any reason.

No-Shows

- Competitors who fail to notify the Competition Secretary of their intention to scratch may have all subsequent ride times reassigned by Competition Management in accordance with USEF Rule GR126.1(3)(b).
- All qualified refunds will be processed within 30 days following the conclusion of the competition.

HORSE SUBSTITUTIONS

- Riders may substitute horses only upon presentation of a veterinary certificate for the incapacitated horse or proof of sale of the originally entered horse.
- Substitutions are permitted only in the classes for which the original horse was entered.
- The Competition Secretary must be notified at least 24 hours prior to the affected class(es).
- A new entry form and applicable office fee are required.

FREESTYLE MUSIC

Competitors may submit music using one of the following methods:

1. Email an MP3 file to Dana Guthrie at dguthrie4@comcast.net no later than 48 hours prior to the competition.
2. Bring an iPad or mobile device equipped with a headphone jack and submit it to the Secretary's Office at check-in.

TEST VERSIONS

- Current editions of USEF Training through Fourth Level tests and all current FEI tests will be used.

CANCELLATIONS

- Competition Management reserves the right to cancel any class or portion of the competition due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accident, emergency, or circumstances beyond its control.
- Every effort will be made to reschedule classes, with priority given to qualifying classes when feasible.
- No refunds will be issued for cancellations resulting from hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, emergencies, or circumstances beyond the control of Competition Management.

COMPETITION NUMBERS

- Competition numbers must be worn and clearly visible whenever a horse is outside its stall, including while being exercised, ridden, hand-walked, or otherwise on the competition grounds.

STABLING

- No horses will be admitted to the grounds before 12:00 PM on Thursday, August 20, 2026.
- Participants must vacate the competition grounds by 9:00 PM on Saturday, August 22, 2026, unless prior arrangements have been approved by Competition Management.
- Permanent 10' x 10' wooden stalls with doors are provided.
- Alteration of stalls or barn structures is strictly prohibited.
- Careful consideration is given to horse and tack stall assignments. Do not occupy any stall that has not been assigned to you.
- Anyone found changing stalls or occupying an unassigned stall without permission from the Stabling Office will be assessed a \$100 fine per stall.
- Placing any item in a stall constitutes use of that stall.
- Additional stalls may be available for rent upon arrival. Please contact the Stable Manager.

Smoking

- NO SMOKING IN OR AROUND THE BARNS.
- This is a zero-tolerance policy. Individuals found smoking in or around the barns may be asked to leave the competition grounds immediately.

Sharps Disposal

- Sharps containers are provided in the barn area and at the Secretary's Office.
- Competition Management may fine any individual, including trainers, exhibitors, owners, or their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

ARENAS & SCHOOLING

- Competition classes will be conducted outdoors in 20m x 60m all-weather sand, geo-felt, and fiber mix arenas.
- Classes may be held in either the Wheeler Ring or Dixon Oval. Competition Management does not guarantee which ring will be used for any class.
- Warm-up areas consist of all-weather sand, geo-felt, and fiber mixed footing.

Lunging

- Lunging is permitted only in designated areas during approved hours.
- All lunging must conclude 30 minutes before scheduled competition classes begin.
- Lunging schedules and designated areas will be posted and strictly enforced.

DOG POLICY

- **DOGS MUST BE ON LEASHES AT ALL TIMES.**
- **Any owner of a loose dog may be fined \$100 by Competition Management and may also be subject to penalties under USEF Rule GR1301.6.**
- **Dog owners are solely responsible for any damage, claims, losses, or actions resulting from their dogs' behavior.**

LIABILITY

- All owners, riders, trainers, and exhibitors are personally responsible for damage to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, agents, or horses.
- Participants are strongly encouraged to maintain adequate liability insurance coverage for participation in equestrian events.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Food Service

- No food service will be available on the competition grounds.
- Numerous restaurants, convenience stores, and food options are located within walking distance or a short drive of the competition grounds.

Arrival After Hours

- If arriving after 9:00 PM, please contact the Competition Manager at 610-416-3839 for instructions regarding parking and stabling.

Parking

- Trailers and vans may not park inside the competition grounds except for brief loading and unloading.
- Parking and security will be provided in designated lots surrounding the competition grounds.
- Competitors should be prepared with wheelbarrows or hand trucks for transporting equipment from parking areas to the stabling area.
- If arriving after dark, please note that lighting in the back barn unloading area is limited.

Ride Times

- Provisional ride times will be posted on Fox Village by Wednesday of the week prior to the competition.
- Official ride times will be posted on Fox Village at 12:00 PM the day before the competition.
- Ride times are subject to change. Competitors are responsible for checking Fox Village for updates prior to the competition.
- Classes may be scheduled out of order.
- Dressage classes must be run in their entirety.
- Failure to enter the arena at the assigned ride time may result in elimination.

Scores

- It is the responsibility of each competitor to verify the accuracy of all scores.
- Scoring errors must be reported to the Competition Secretary within one hour of the official posting of the affected class or before the end of the competition day, whichever occurs first.

Veterinary & Farrier Services

- A veterinarian and farrier will be on call throughout the competition.
- Emergency contact information will be posted in both the Show Office and Stable Office.

Foreign Competitors

- Non-U.S. citizens and foreign competitors must provide proof, in English, of current membership in good standing with their National Federation or hold current USEF membership in good standing.

Protective Headgear

- In accordance with USEF Rule DR120.6 and GR801, anyone mounted on a horse anywhere on the competition grounds must wear properly fitted protective headgear meeting or exceeding ASTM/SEI standards and bearing the SEI certification label.

- Any rider violating this rule will be prohibited from further riding until compliant headgear is properly worn.

Bridle Numbers

Bridle numbers must be worn at all times on the show grounds.

USEF Membership Statement

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Protective Headgear

From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all

classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. (GR120.6)

Hold Harmless Clause

Understanding that horse sports may be hazardous and dangerous, even leading to permanent injury or death, each owner, rider, spectator, and other participant assumes any and all risk of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless, regardless of negligent acts or omissions, Dunmovin, Second Century LLC, the show management, show committee, and all horse show personnel.

Pennsylvania Equine Warning

Warning: Under Pennsylvania law an equine professional and equine activity sponsor is not liable for an injury to or death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

Conduct of Show

All standard USEF Rules will apply. Please refer to Standard Rules listed in Omnibus or your USEF Rulebook. Show Management reserves the right to limit entries, add or divide classes, to add or substitute judges, to cancel awards and prizes and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show Management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management.

USEF Motorized Vehicle Statement

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating

a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

USDF Horse Welfare Statement

As those engaged in equestrian sport, we are committed to ensuring our horses receive the best possible care to the best of our ability. We acknowledge that we are the caretakers of our horses and as such we are committed to always, without exception, treating our horses with dignity, fairness, kindness, and understanding.

We realize that horses, whether in a herd or as an individual, will communicate contentment, fear, pain and confusion in the only way they can, which often takes the form of physical reactions that can be misinterpreted and misunderstood.

Therefore, we believe it is our obligation to seek to understand our horses with the goal of providing care and training methods that are never the manifestation of anger, frustration or cruelty. We are committed to these principles at all times, whether on or off the show grounds.

We are committed to humane treatment and application of these principles on behalf of all animals including but not limited to horses, donkeys, mules, companion animals, and pets. Lack of humane treatment, whether the result of actions taken, or by care withheld, will not be tolerated.

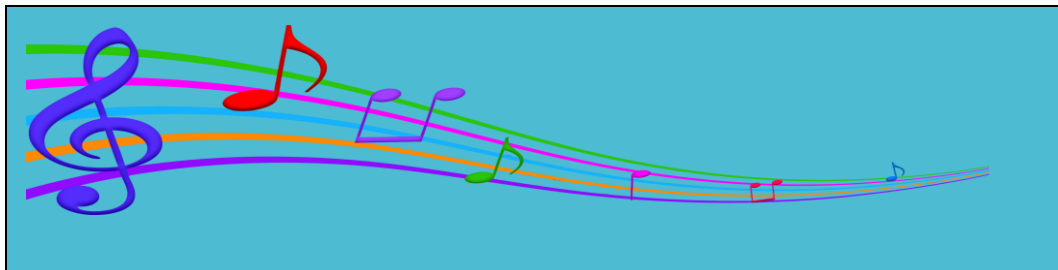

Rules:

- Team entry fee is \$60 per Team, in addition to class entry fees.
 - The team competition is open to Junior/Young Riders, Adult Amateurs and a maximum of two open riders per team.
 - Teams can consist of 5-6 riders at any level, with their highest score of the day counted.
 - Team members can ride both or 1 day of the show
 - If a team member rides both Friday and Saturday, the highest score from either day will count towards the team average
 - The lowest score will be a drop score.
 - Each horse may only show on one team, but a rider can show on up to 2 teams.
 - No more than 2 riders at each level.
 - The combined scores average will be the final team score. Highest team score wins. In case of ties, the highest single score of a non-professional on the team will decide.
 - No substitution of horse or rider on a team after the first ride of the team test has started.
- ✓ Ribbons and prizes to Champion (Ribbons through 6th place).

2026 Membership & Eligibility Requirements

USEF Membership	Riders, owners, trainers, and coaches (if applicable) must provide current USEF membership information on the entry form. Non-members will be charged the USEF Show Pass fee. Competitions may not accept payment for Show Pass fees.
Safe Sport Compliance	USEF Life and Senior Active members, and participants with regular contact with minor athletes, must complete U.S. Center for SafeSport training and comply with SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and MAAPP policies. See usef.org/safe-sport .
USEF Show Pass	Riders, owners, handlers, and drivers are limited to one Show Pass per competition year (Dec 1–Nov 30). Trainers/coaches (including parents signing as trainers) are not eligible and must hold Senior Competing membership. Show Pass purchased online at usef.org/show-pass .
USEF Horse Recording	Horses in qualifying classes must have an Annual or Lifetime Recording.
Horse ID (USEF)	USEF Horse ID or Recording Number required. Obtain at usef.org .
USDF Membership	USDF membership required for rider, owner/lessee, and horse.
USDF Non-Member Fees	Non-members are subject to the USDF Non-Member fee. An affidavit and fee may apply if proof cannot be provided.
USDF Horse Registration	Horses must have USDF HID or Lifetime Registration; Lifetime required for qualifying classes.
Para-Equestrian	Para-Equestrian competitors and horses must meet USDF membership and horse registration requirements.
GAIG/USDF Qualifying Classes	Additional qualifying fee required. Riders must hold an Active USEF membership and a USDF Participating Membership. Owners must hold a USDF Participating or Business Membership and USEF membership. Horses must have USEF Annual or Lifetime Recording and USDF Lifetime Registration.
Adult Amateur	Exhibitors must hold current USEF Amateur status.
Junior/Young Rider	Juniors eligible through year age 18; Young Riders age 16–21; compete as Adults beginning year age 22. (DR119.3) Riders age 16–17 may compete as Junior or Young Rider. DOB required on entry form.
Horse ID (USDF)	USDF HID used for score tracking; obtain at usdf.org .
GAIG/USDF Eligibility	Horses must meet USEF & USDF registration and ownership requirements for GAIG/USDF qualifying classes.
CBLM Qualifying Classes Offered	GMO membership required; see cblm.org for rules.

Each competitor is responsible for providing management with the correct USDF (United States Equestrian Federation) association numbers for the horse, owner, and rider before the competition day(s). RIDER UNDERSTANDS THAT: Horseback riding is a hazardous activity containing numerous inherent, obvious and non-obvious risks that always present themselves in such activity, despite all safety precautions. Related injuries can be severe, resulting in more lasting residual effects than injuries from other activities. Horses are unpredictable and participation in activities in the presence of horses always involves an element of risk. Pursuant to Act 93 of 2005, the Pennsylvania Activity Immunity Act, "You assume the risk of equine activities pursuant to Pennsylvania Law."

C. Nature of Riding Horses

DUNMOVIN DRESSAGE DAYS LLC is not responsible for total or partial acts, occurrences, or elements of nature that can scare a horse or cause it to fall or react in any unsafe way.

D. Rider Responsibility

RIDER UNDERSTANDS THAT: Rider is in primary control of the horse and DUNMOVIN DRESSAGE DAYS LLC is not responsible for Rider's actions or inactions. Rider is responsible for their own safety and that of an unborn child if Rider is pregnant. Pregnant persons should ride horses only under the advice of their physician.

E. Protective Equipment/Headgear Requirement

As a condition of riding any horse in the Dunmovin Dressage Days I and/or II, Rider is required by DUNMOVIN DRESSAGE DAYS LLC to wear and utilized all protective clothing and equipment, including long pants, gloves, protective headgear and proper riding shoes with heels, at all times while mounting, riding, and dismounting horses. The headgear and its harness must be secured, properly fitted and fastened at all times while mounting, riding, and dismounting horses. If Rider is in violation of this requirement at any time, Rider must immediately discontinue riding until such headgear is properly in place.

Closed toe shoes that cover the whole foot are required by all persons on the horse facilities, at all times when working with or around horses. Rider is responsible for ensuring all their spectators and guests abide by this rule if they come within 6 feet of a horse.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



2026 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2026 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).

A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual Recorded Farm/Business (with Senior Active Competing Farm Owner in good standing)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider.

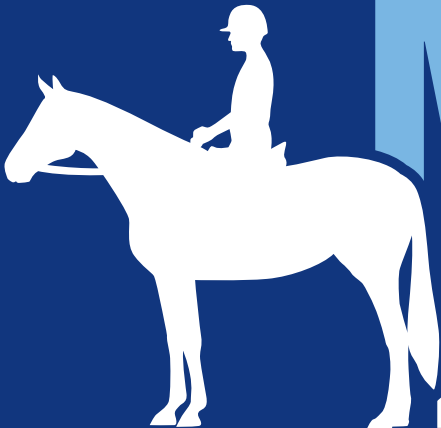
